### Remembrance Sunday

#### Greetings from Eileen

Dear Friends,

Remembrance Sunday is an unrelenting reminder that wars cost the sacrifice of lives. From the sin of brother against brother, this sin of instigating war is not justified nor validated simply because it is nation against nation.



On Remembrance Sunday we shall hear again Prophet Amos' words that war  
*"is darkness, not light;  
 as if someone fled from a lion,  
 and was met by a bear;  
 or went into the house and rested a hand against the wall,  
 and was bitten by a snake."*

Many of you remember this reality. We pray that those in power may exercise their power in love and for good, and not choose to instigate and promote war.

I've been away for mainly 2 events. The first was a residential meeting of the College of Bishops. The programme was intense and rigorous, but bishops were dressed down, relaxed with one another, and there was warm fellowship. I am one of 3 non-episcopal clergy sitting in the House and College. I walked the labyrinth with you, my congregations at St Andrew's and St Mary's. God brought to mind new insights of our journey over 6 years together. I thank you for your care for me and appreciate your effort.

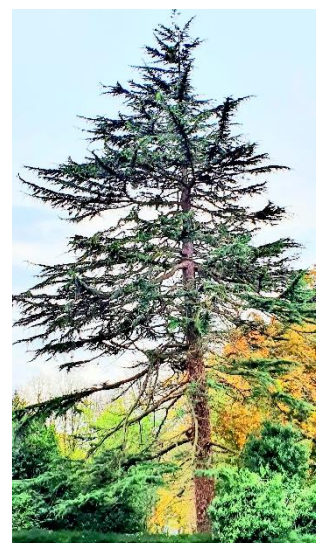

### **First Reading (Remembrance): Amos 5:18-20, 23-24**

<sup>18</sup> Alas for you who desire the day of the Lord!  
Why do you want the day of the Lord?  
It is darkness, not light;  
<sup>19</sup> as if someone fled from a lion,  
and was met by a bear;  
or went into the house and rested a hand against the wall,  
and was bitten by a snake.  
<sup>20</sup> Is not the day of the Lord darkness, not light,  
and gloom with no brightness in it?  
  
<sup>23</sup> Take away from me the noise of your songs;  
I will not listen to the melody of your harps.  
<sup>24</sup> But let justice roll down like waters,  
and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream.

### **Gospel Reading (Remembrance): John 15:9-17**

<sup>9</sup> As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. <sup>10</sup> If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love.  
<sup>11</sup> I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.  
<sup>12</sup> 'This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. <sup>13</sup> No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. <sup>14</sup> You are my friends if you do what I command you. <sup>15</sup> I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father.  
<sup>16</sup> You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. <sup>17</sup> I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.
