Engage with Children, Youth, and Young People to intentionally and diligently reach out to the younger generations, engaging with them to offset the voices and noises of their everyday experience that excludes God, and create opportunities for them to know Jesus as their personal friend, Lord, and Saviour.
- 4. Care for God's Creation to take up God's call to restore creation, to live in ways that bless and not corrupt or destroy God's gifts in creation, and to encourage our communities to value our environment and the natural beauty around us.

We are 'a whole people of God'. I have responded to the call of Jesus The Good Shepherd to be a shepherd in our parishes, and I am grateful for the gift of many who also follow Jesus as shepherds of our people. But not all shepherds are Ordained Priests; you know this in your experience. Some have tended the pasture; some have made good the structures that keep the flock safe; others have kept watch over the flock and helped to nurture new and young members of the flock.

We have begun a new season in which God is calling you as well as me to renew and refresh our pasture and flock, and to encourage

Gospel Reading: Matthew 11:2-11

² When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples ³ and said to him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?' ⁴ Jesus answered them, 'Go and tell John what you hear and see: ⁵ the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. ⁶ And blessed is anyone who takes no offence at me.'

⁷ As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? ⁸ What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. ⁹ What then did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. ¹⁰ This is the one about whom it is written, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,

who will prepare your way before you."

¹¹ Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he.
