Winston St Andrew's began with a VE80 service led by churchwarden Lynne, lay chair Chrissie, and Royal Maundy recipient Graham last Sunday; followed by **Gainford St Mary's Act of Worship with Gainford Primary School joining the community at the War Memorial** on VE Day; and in the morning and the same evening **Gainford St Mary's, Staindrop St Mary's and Ingleton St John the Evangelist Church's bells were rung**. Although poignant for me

awaiting the commemoration of VJ in a few months' time, I am proudly thankful to be in Britain for our powerful commemorations. Did you watch any of the national commemoration events on Television? I thought both the service at Westminster Abbey and the evening in Horse Guards Parade were outstanding. Joy and rejoicing are right amidst continuing sadness and urgent prayer for those places in conflict and strife.

'White smoke' welcomed a new Pope! We share with our brothers and sisters of the Roman Catholic church, the election of a new leader in succession to the apostle Peter, **Robert Francis Prevost**, who has chosen the name **Leo the 14th**. My particular joy is that he had professed and is professing again Jesus Christ as Lord in whose life he will continue to serve, and that humility and care for the poor and needy will continue to mark his ministry. He has set out to continue sharing the Gospel as the late Pope Francis had done. Thanks be to God!

CHRISTIAN AID week begins this Sunday, also Vocation Sunday.

Vocation Sunday is timely as we call on everyone at our Annual Meetings to consider our gifts and serving God in our churches and parishes, even as the Cardinals prayed for God's guidance on the colleague who is called to be Pope. First Reading (EASTER 4): Acts 9:36-43

³⁶ Now in Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. ³⁷ At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room upstairs. ³⁸ Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' ³⁹ So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. ⁴⁰ Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. ⁴¹ He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. ⁴² This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. ⁴³ Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

The Gospel (EASTER 4): John 10:22-30

²² At that time the festival of the Dedication took place in Jerusalem. It was winter, ²³ and Jesus was walking in the temple, in the portico of Solomon. ²⁴ So the Jews gathered around him and said to him, 'How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly.' ²⁵ Jesus answered, 'I have told you, and you do not believe. The works that I do in my Father's name testify to me; ²⁶ but you do not believe, because you do not belong to my sheep. ²⁷ My sheep hear my voice. I know them, and they follow me. ²⁸ I give them eternal life, and they will never perish. No one will snatch them out of my hand. ²⁹ What my Father has given me is greater than all else, and no one can snatch it out of the Father's hand. ³⁰ The Father and I are one.'
