
Last week on Remembrance Sunday and Armistice Day, we gathered to remember the fallen, who put themselves in harms way because it was the right thing to do. Because there's the bully in the playground and the bully who has gathered a following to oppress in the work place and in the world, peace that is born of justice, which comes from loving one another, cannot be taken for granted. As people of Christian faith, who have found the reality of Christ, we are able to say: 'God has made us one in Christ. He has set his seal upon us and, as a pledge of what is to come, has given the Spirit to dwell in our hearts. Alleluia.'



This week, some of our communities joined the television watchers across the UK to greet the Children in Need Presenter Sarah Cox, as she ran through Staindrop and Winston (with Pudsey the Bear) to raise funds for this cause. A young generation that begins in dire straits should surprise, disappoint, distress, and raise indignant action. A brave untaking in the spotlight, Sara Cox must complete the equivalent of 5 marathons to bring attention to Children in Need, and to raise funds.

On Saturday 15th November from 10.30am to 6pm, GATHER partners with The Hearth of Auckland Project in Bishop Auckland to invite caregivers to a Pilgrimage Day, to care for themselves, to pause and take a breath, and to reflect on the gift of their caregiving. They will be treated to a journey into lives of some depicted in the paintings of the Mining Art Gallery and the Spanish Art Gallery, and into the terraces of the walled gardens layered with health in natures edible vitamins. Walking through the park's openness and then enveloped in the mystery of Belbiurne Woods, how would participants' minds and spirits be stirred? Together with GATHER leads Tom and Sheila, I shall share in leading this day and look forward to being enlightened myself of others' stories and my own.

First Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:6-13

⁶ Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷ For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸ and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labour we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹ This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰ For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹ For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹² Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

The Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

- ⁵ When some were speaking about the temple, how it was adorned with beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God, he said, ⁶ 'As for these things that you see, the days will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down.'
- ⁷ They asked him, 'Teacher, when will this be, and what will be the sign that this is about to take place?' ⁸ And he said, 'Beware that you are not led astray; for many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and, "The time is near!" Do not go after them.
- ⁹ 'When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately.' ¹⁰ Then he said to them, 'Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; ¹¹ there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven.
- ¹² 'But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³ This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴ So make up your minds not to prepare your defence in advance; ¹⁵ for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶ You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷ You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸ But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹ By your endurance you will gain your souls.
